Martin is Halifax Harriers', Vice President and past Chairman of their successful race committee. He has run 20 marathons (four of them under 3 hours), 14 triathlons and 10 consecutive Three Peaks races (five of them under 3:30), so he knows a thing or two about setting goals and achieving results.

Lattitude7 has a focused CSR policy and each event has been completed to raise funds for charities, such as: Whizz Kids, Outward Bound Trust, Cancer Research UK, St. John's Ambulance, Calderdale Special Care Baby Unit, Bermerside Special School in Halifax and Children with Leukaemia. In 2013, together with six other riders, Martin cycled 937 miles from Land's End to John O' Groats. They raised £106,000 which paid for 23 apprenticeships in Calderdale. In 2014 Martin completed the world's toughest endurance race, the UK IRONMAN triathlon and, in the process, raised £2,000 for SCOPE disability charity.

Martin is co-chair of Working Wonders, a Calderdale-based apprentice charity and he provides significant amounts of pro-bono, work-ready support, for young people.

Martin was a member of The Professional Speaking Association for two years and gives entertaining talks on a number of subjects, both at home and overseas.
